Toton had a watermill to grind wheat into flour. There is no photo or drawing of the mill. **Can you design and make a model to suggest what Toton's mill looked like?**

The watermill in Toton was turned into one powered by steam in the Victorian era. It then became a soap and bone works and was demolished sometime after 1906.

Create a model mill apply by September 14th

- Work in a group or as in individual
- Use materials of your choice
- Decorate it with your choice of materials
- Choose a period from Anglo Saxon, Medieval, Tudor, Georgian or Victorian
- Size - no bigger (front to back) 17 inches or 45 cm – width (wheel pit to end) 30 inches or 75 cm
- **Your mill must have a waterwheel**



Models will be judged by an archaeologist on Saturday September 26th

Bring your model (with your name/s and your caption) to the Sports Pavilion on Manor Farm Recreation Ground Toton between 10.00 a.m. and 11.00 September 26th.

The best model/s will be on permanent display in Toton library.

Research has shown mill/mills have been in Toton since the Domesday book.

Archaeology has revealed

- Timber posts dating to 1230s acting as ? (edge of pond support for mill?)
- A mix of walls from different periods & brick floors
- Stone blocks (perhaps foundations of a mill) side of a wheel pit
- Bricks on top of stone blocks & Victorian brick walls
- Different rooms for different purposes
